The attributes of God are revealed in all creation. In Psalm 19:1-6, David compares the constancy of the heavens to the perfection of God's law. As the sun, moon, and stars reveal God's perfect order of creation, so also His law reveals the government of God. Thus, the Law of the Lord is as perfect as He is. Rightly followed and applied the Law of the Lord converts the whole person. The Law establishes guidelines by which God brings harmony into our lives. How did the psalmist David express his attitude towards God's perfect Law? **PSALM 40:8** "I ______ to do Your _____, O my God, and Your _____ is within my _____." When David expressed his delight to do God's will, he gave evidence his heart was an abiding place of God's law. These were not new words. When Jesus said this, the four gospels were not yet written. Jesus was quoting Deuteronomy 6:5, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength." Jesus was reminding a Jewish lawyer that his obligation to God does not exclude obligations to others, thus Jesus added, "Love your neighbor."

When God finished writing the Ten Commandments, they were complete. They contained all obligations to God and to humanity. God's Law is as complete as God is. In describing the works of God, the wise man Solomon wrote, "I know that whatever God does, it shall be forever. Nothing can be added to it, and nothing taken from it. God does it, that men should fear before Him." Ecclesiastes 3:14 (NKJV)

God does not want us to be afraid of Him but to reverence Him, by showing obedience to His commandments. The Bible reveals no reason to disobey God's Law.

The apostle Paul delighted in his idea of keeping God's Law. When he said "according to the inward man," he meant that it is his mind and heart's desire. However, he acknowledged a conflict in himself. Paul wrote, "I see another law in my members." The law that Paul saw in his members was battling against the "law of his mind." He described the law in his members as "the law of sin." It's obvious that Paul was not calling God's Law the "law of sin" because he already concluded that God's Law is perfect. Paul was describing why it's not possible to keep a perfect law until the carnal nature is changed.

13 How did the apostle Paul describe the remedy for his inability to keep God's Law?
ROMANS 7:24 "O man that I am! Who will me from this of?"
In Paul's struggle to keep God's Law he never mentions Jesus or the Spirit, which is the reason why he struggled. His flesh repeatedly failed him. But Paul asks, "Who will deliver me?" Thus, deliverance from the penalty of sin is the remedy for humanity's inability to keep God's Law. Jesus accomplished our deliverance, when Jesus gave His life to atone for its penalty. The apostle Paul now asks for deliverance from the power of sin. He is tired of being condemned for his frailty.

The powerful truth of Paul's deliverance is, he was no longer trying to keep God's Law in himself. He was brought into harmony with God's Law by being placed "In Christ Jesus." In the next two verses Paul records his preamble of deliverance. "For what the law could not do in that it was weak through the flesh, God did by sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, on account of sin: He condemned sin in the flesh, that the righteous requirement of the law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit." Romans 8:3-4 (NKJV).

Jesus empowers His followers to keep His law because they cannot reflect His character without doing so. That is why Jesus said, "If you keep My Commandments, you will abide in My love just as I have kept My Father's Commandments and abide in His love." John 15:10 (NKJV).

Rejecting God's Perfect Law is dismantling society. However, the issue is not God's Perfect Law, it is the imperfect heart of humanity. Sinful man is incapable of keeping a sinless Law.

Every effort on the part of sinful humanity to live in harmony with God's Law, has fallen short of God's ideal. Even yet the appeal from a loving Savior is "If you love Me, keep my Commandments." John 14:15 (NKJV).

How can imperfect humans live in harmony with God's Perfect Law? Jesus is the good news, He provides the power to live to a standard far superior to our nature. When God's Law is honored, the heart is renewed, the character refined, and our life reflects the reality that God's Perfect Law reveals God's Perfect Love.
