God's ownership is not a shared partnership. Everything belongs to Him. The totality of creation is the work of His hands. All things animate and inanimate belong to God. 3 How does the psalmist David describe God's ownership? PSALM 24:1 "The \_\_\_\_\_ is the LORD'S, and \_\_\_\_ its \_\_\_\_\_, the \_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_ who dwell \_\_\_\_\_." From the dawn of time to the present, every living thing began with God. Concerning God, David wrote in Psalm 33:9 "For He spoke, and it was done; He commanded, and it stood fast." Creation not only began with God, He sustains it. Acts 17:28 reveals, "In Him we live and move and have our being." The works of God's hands continue to speak of His power. 4 How does God count His livestock? **PSALM 50:10** "For \_\_\_\_\_\_ beast of the \_\_\_\_\_ is \_\_\_\_, and the \_\_\_\_\_ on a \_\_\_\_\_ hills." God does not count His livestock by heads, He counts by hills. The next time you see a ranch or a farm with animals remember they belong to God. Since we created nothing, we are stewards of what belongs to God. 5 The Bible proves that everything on earth belongs to God, but what about everything in the heavens? JEREMIAH 32:27 "Behold, I am the LORD, the of all  Is there too for Me?"
HEBREWS 1:10"You, LORD, in the beginning laid the of the, and the are the work of Your"
God owns and sustains everything in heaven and earth. Nothing is too hard for Him. His wealth is immeasurable. All the life sustaining forces of the universe are the product of God's creative power.
7 How does the Bible reveal the extent of God's wealth?
HAGGAI 2:8 "'The is Mine, and the is Mine,' says the of hosts."
The wealth of God is not dependent on the stock market or the financial reserves of any nation. Those that trust God are connected to an economy that is never depleted. This is confirmed in Philippians 4:19, "And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus." It is a blessing to know that our needs are in God's hands.
8 Why is it best to trust God more than ourselves?
<b>1 TIMOTHY 6:7</b> "For we brought into this, and it is we can carry"
Someone once said, "Look in the hands of the baby to see what he brought into the world and you will know what he will take out." It's humbling to realize that nothing belongs to us. However, it is encouraging to trust that God will provide whatever we need. Matthew 6:33 contains the formula assuring us of God's reliability; "But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you."
What is the source of our riches and wealth?
ECCLESIASTES 5:19 "As for every man to whom God has given and, and given him to eat of it, to his heritage and in his labor—this is the of God."
Our riches and wealth come from God. The strength to work is also a gift from God. Many fail to acknowledge physical labor as being another of God's gifts. The air we breathe and our bodies' operations are directed by God.
The verses in Deuteronomy 8:11-17 outline God's blessings. However, there is a caution in verse 18, "And you shall remember the Lord your God, for it is

He who gives you power to get wealth, that He may establish His covenant which He swore to your fathers, as it is this day." God fulfills His covenant of blessings with those that acknowledge Him as their source.

OUR STEWARDSHIP TO GOD
10 How did Abraham express his appreciation to God?
GENESIS 14:20 "'And be God Most High, who has delivered your into your hand.' And gave a of all."
Abraham returned a tithe of his possessions to God as a pledge of gratitude. A tithe is one-tenth of our increase. Abraham expressed his thankfulness to God by returning one-tenth of his livestock, agriculture, and money. In similar manner, David the psalmist asked, "What shall I render to the Lord for all His benefits toward me?" Psalm 116:12 (NKJV).
11 What were the Israelites told to do to determine the portion of their possessions that were holy to the Lord?
LEVITICUS 27:32 "And concerning the of the or the, of passes under the rod, the one shall be to the"
God provided the needs of the children of Israel. Rather than allowing them to keep the totality for themselves, God tested them. He told them that they could keep ninety percent of their possessions. The remaining one-tenth belonged to the Lord: it was holy and was to be returned to God.
12 To where was the Lord's tithe returned?
MALACHI 3:10 "Bring the into the, that there may be in My, and Me now in this,' says the LORD of hosts, 'If I will not for you the of heaven and out for you such that there will not be room enough to receive it."  God appealed to the Israelites to supply His house with food by bringing all the tithes into the storehouse. The storehouse was the temple treasury. If the people complied with God's requirements, He promised to bless them so abundantly that there would be no room to receive it. Malachi records this story to remind us of how God tested His people. It was also a reminder that when we return to God what is His, He stretches and blesses what remains. With God's blessing, nine-tenths goes further than ten-tenths.
13 What else did God covenant to do for the faithful?
MALACHI 3:11-12 "And I will the for your, so that he will not the of your, nor shall the vine to bear for you in the, says the LORD of hosts; (12) 'And all nations will call you, for you will be a land,' says the LORD of hosts."  It was not unusual for locusts to consume the crops and drought to affect the harvest. But for those that remained faithful, God guaranteed His promise of protection from the consuming locusts and crop failure. This
protection testified to surrounding nations the difference that faithfulness

to God makes.

MALACHI 3:9 "Will a man God? Yet you have Me! But you say, 'In what have we robbed?' In and
God considered it robbery not only when one-tenth was not returned, but also when offerings where not returned. Israel's needs were dependent on the faithfulness of each person. Not only did the unfaithful one deny himself of the blessing, he affected everyone. Malachi 3:9 says, "You are cursed with a curse, for you have robbed Me, even this whole nation."

NEHEMIAH 10:37 "To bring the, our offerings, the fruit from all kinds of trees, the new wine and oil, to the priests, to the of the house of our God; and to bring the of our land to the, for the Levites should receive the tithes in all our farming"  The Levites, who were priests in Israel, were supported by the tithe brought into the storehouse. It was part of their inheritance. They were employed in the service of the Lord and the tithes were their sustenance. In this way the Levitical priests could dedicate their lives to the work of the Lord.

PSALM 1:3 "He shall be like a planted by the of water, that brings forth its in its season, whose also shall not; and whatever he shall"  God desires to bless, but the conditions for those blessings must be met. God is the provider of all. He gives us what we need and then asks us to show our gratitude through faithfulness. Faithfulness will be rewarded
because God's promises are true.

The Bible describes blessings as reciprocal. We receive, as we are willing to give. The standard we use for giving will be the standard used for receiving. We activate our blessing through the way that we give. The motive and amount behind your giving, determines your receiving.
18 What kind of attitude should accompany our stewardship?
2 CORINTHIANS 9:7 "So let each one give as he in his, not or of; for God loves a giver"

Our attitude should be the first consideration when we give. If we give "grudgingly" or of "necessity" the gift is tainted. How would you feel if someone owed you and they tossed the money in your direction? Would you consider that person cheerful? Likewise, God reads the motives of the heart.
