Life, without the Holy Spirit's power, is like a major city experiencing a power outage or a car unable to start, because the battery has died: no power no life. Flowers nourished through their roots and Christians planted in Christ will grow and flourish.

Getting connected is just the beginning. Bible study, prayer, Christian service, and the exercise of spiritual gifts must be incorporated in daily living and worship to continue to grow in Christ. This outline has been designed to lead you into learning the important elements of your connection and growth in your Christian walk. The promise is, "For it is God who works in you both to will and to do for His good pleasure." Philippians 2:13 As you study, you will discover that there is no greater joy than growing and sharing your faith in Jesus.

GETTING CONNECTED

- Romans 6:4** - We enter a new life in Christ.
- John 15:4, 5** - Without Jesus we are incapable of accomplishing anything.
- Colossians 3:1-4** - Set our affections on things above not on earthly things.
- 1 Corinthians 6:11** - We were sanctified and set apart for a holy use.
- 1 Peter 2:2** - Our desire is the milk or nourishment of the Word of God
- Galatians 5:22, 23** - The fruit of the Spirit, (love, joy, peace, etc.), is displayed and alive.
- John 8:36** - We find complete freedom in Christ.
- Philippians 4:13** - We receive power to accomplish all things through Christ.

- Ephesians 4:14** - We are no longer children that are easy to sway.
- Ephesians 6:10** - We become strong in the Lord and in the power of His full armor.

THE RESULTS OF THE CONNECTION

- Philippians 1:6** - Jesus begins a work in us that He will perform and complete.
- 2 Peter 3:18** - We grow in the grace and in knowledge of our Lord and Savior.
- Romans 15:16** - We are sanctified, or made holy, by the Holy Spirit's work in us.
- 1 Corinthians 1:2** - We are continually being sanctified in Christ Jesus.
- Romans 10:17** - Our faith increases by the study of God's Word.
- 1 John 3:1-2** - We receive the assurance that one day we will be just like Jesus.

- Acts 2:38** - We must repent and be baptized before we receive Holy Spirit.
- 1 Corinthians 2:14** - The Holy Spirit enlightens our understanding.
