Baptism is the ceremony of spiritually entering into the death, burial, and resurrection of Jesus. Full immersion in the water represents our spiritual burial. Our sins are washed away and we are raised into a new life in Christ. We are no longer enemies against God, we are now His sons and daughters. The Holy Spirit comes into our lives to empower us to live the new life in Christ. We experience victory in that new walk as long as we remain connected to the source of our power, Jesus Christ.

OUR CONDITION BEFORE BAPTISM

- Isaiah 53:6** - We have all gone astray following our own ways.
- Isaiah 64:6** - We are unclean and our righteousness is like filthy rags.
- Isaiah 59:2** - Our iniquities have separated us from God.
- Romans 3:23** - All have sinned and fall short of God’s glory.
- Romans 5:8** - We are sinners by nature.
- Romans 6:23** - The wages of sin is death.
- Ephesians 2:1** - We were dead in trespasses and sins.
- 1 Corinthians 15:22** - We inherited death because of Adam.
- Romans 5:12** - Through Adam death affected the whole human race.
- Jeremiah 17:9** - The Human heart is deceitful and desperately wicked
- Isaiah 24:5** - The earth and its inhabitants are defiled.
- Proverbs 13:15** - Because of transgression life is hard.

THE NEED FOR BAPTISM

- John 3:5** - Unless we are born again we cannot enter the kingdom.

- Acts 22:16** - The water of baptism is a symbol of washing away sin.
- Mark 16:16** - Belief and baptism are necessary for salvation.

THE TRANSFORMATION THAT FOLLOWS BAPTISM

- Romans 6:4,5** - Baptism brings us into the likeness of Christ.
- Galatians 2:20** - Following baptism our new life can only come from Christ.
- Galatians 3:27** - When we are baptized we are clothed in the life of Jesus.
- 2 Corinthians 5:17** - When we accept Christ our lives are made new.
- Romans 6:9** - Baptism removes us from the condemnation of death.
- Matthew 3:16** - The Holy Spirit is present at the baptism.
- Romans 8:1** - We live free from condemnation as long we stay in Christ.
- John 1:12** - As we receive Christ we become a part of His royal family.
